Many people ask us if we are looking forward to getting back to PNG and the easy answer is yes. However it is going to be tough to leave all of our family and friends again even though we know that the Lord is going before us and desires that we serve Him in this way. In one sense it is so easy to settle down here again and we see the great spiritual needs in this country, and yet we think about those who still do not have access to the Gospel in their own language.

New Baby!!

We are pleased to announce the birth of our daughter. Georgia Grace Hulley was born on the 26th of April at 12.03 a.m and weighed 7lb 7oz. She is growing well and putting on weight and has already changed in appearance so much since her birth. Her 'big brother' absolutely adores her and smothers her with kisses.

As soon as Georgia was born we had to get moving in order to get a visa for her before our booked return flight. We managed to get a birth certificate for her within two days and then we sent for her passport. The passport took about a week and a half to come so we had everything we needed to get a visa. We had an email from the Government Reps in Port Moresby, PNG to say "We have checked at the Dept. of Immigration in regards to Georgia's entry permit/visa approval. Actually, they are not posting anything and haven't for over a month and a half now. ". We sent the documentation off thinking that it may take several weeks and praise God we got the visa stamped passport back in 4 days!!

Firstly we will be meeting with the other two couples in our team to discuss where we hope to locate. At present it seems that Kamea is still our first option. The most recent survey that we went on in Gulf Province was to the Kamea people and NTM leadership are eager to send a team there. Dan and the other two men will need to do at least one further survey into Kamea so that they can determine what would be the most strategic place to locate to and to meet the village elders to mark out house building sites.
